



Simple Treat Holder

Supplies

Paper: Chocolate Chip #102128 or Early Espresso #119686 Cardstock
Whisper White Cardstock # 100730
Cajun Craze Cardstock # 126965
Summer Starfruit Designer Series Paper - 2012-2014 InColor DSP Stack #130137

Ink: Chocolate Chip # 136979
Old Olive # 126953

Stamp Set: Harvest of Thanks # 131736 (w) or # 131739 (cl)

Tools: 1/2" Circle Punch #119869
1-3/8" Circle Punch # 119860
1" Square Punch # 124094
Big Shot Die-Cutting Machine # 113439
Big Shot Magnetic Platform # 130658
Window Frames Collection Framelits # 129021
Bitty Banners Framelits # 129267

Embellishments: Chocolate Chip 3/4" Chevron Ribbon # 130014

Adhesives: Snail # 104332
Stampin Dimensionals # 104430

Directions

Cut a piece of Chocolate Chip or Early Espresso cardstock into strips 2-3/4" x 8-1/2" (*Bonus: 1 piece of cardstock will yield 4 strips without any waste!*)

Score along the long edge at 3-3/4" and 4-3/4" inches. Use a bone folder to get a sharp crease on these score lines. This creates the holder with a 1" flat base.

Hold the 2 top edges together and punch with a 1/2" Circle Punch in the center to hold the ribbon.

Die cut the Summer Starfruit paper with the Window Frames Framelits. (*Helpful Hint: The Magnetic Platform rocks when using the Framelits dies. Once you use the magnetic platform you'll wonder how you ever lived without it!*)

Cut a piece of Cajun Craze cardstock into 2-5/8" x 1/2" strip. Use the square punch to create the flag ends on this strip.

Stamp the turkey image on Whisper White cardstock and punch out the center circle area with the 1-3/8" circle punch. Stamp the Gratitude Sentiment onto Whisper White cardstock with Old Olive ink. Use the Bitty Banner framelits to die cut this shape.



Using Snail Adhesive, adhere the Summer Starfruit shape directly to the front of the treat holder. Adhere the Cajun Craze banner in the center of that piece. Using a Stampin' Dimensional place the Turkey image in the center. Using small pieces of Stampin' Dimensionals on each side of the Gratitude Banner, adhere that along the bottom edge of the turkey image.



I used a 3" wide x 4-3/4" high clear cellophane bag (non-Stampin' Up! – available at most craft stores in the candy making aisle.)

I put the little acorn candies that I made in the bag and folded over the top and stapled this to the back side of the treat holder to hold it in place. Then I used a 6" piece of ribbon to tie the treat holder together. A simple knot is all that is needed.

Your guests will enjoy this as much as you'll enjoy making it!

Feel free to switch out the colors, images & sentiments to coordinate with whatever holiday or party theme when you need a simple party favor!
